

1. Time restrictions. All craft demonstrations and instructions will be given on Monday March 6. After this day each student must make time to complete their traditional crafts ready for judging by Thursday March 10, 2011.
2. *Only current work done by students during the Jr. Games will be allowed.*
3. Traditional Craft is considered any item made as per specific instructions/guidelines outlined by Event Organizer.
4. All Items may be taken after all judging has taken place.
5. All traditional craft material will be provided by the host community.
6. Craft Evaluation/Craft judging criteria: exhibit reflects the craft was completed according to basic directions; exhibitor has incorporated his/her own unique creativity into exhibit; the exhibit is neat & clean; exhibit demonstrates workmanship and skill; exhibit is aesthetically pleasing; skill needed is challenging, yet suitable for age; appropriate finishing perfects the exhibit. This set of criteria will apply to finished items only.
7. Exhibit Limit – Each community must submit 2 entries for Judging. *Each exhibitor must finish and submit 2 craft entries. Two pieces per exhibitor are eligible for judging.*
8. *Crafts will be judged by a five member panel that will include a games organizer, A games representative from outside of Buffalo Narrows, (To be named Later), and a local elder.*
9. *No names or identifying marks will be placed on the project for judging.*
10. *Medals will be awarded to 1st 2nd and 3rd place finishers.*
11. *Points are awarded on the basis that 2 craft items are submitted per participant. If only 1 craft is submitted or 1 and a second partial craft is submitted points will be lost.*
12. *All Craft participants will be competing against each other.*
